STORY BACKGROUND

The book entitled "The Acts of the Apostles" chronicles the story of the birth of the Church of Jesus Christ and it's influence in Jerusalem, Judea, and throughout the Near East in the seasons following Jesus' death, burial, resurrection, and ascension. As the gift of the Holy Spirit fell, indwelled, and filled the early Christians with power and love, a community of passionate and committed followers naturally formed. As with any community of people being joined together by a common pursuit, a culture developed. In those early days, they became known in Jerusalem for their commitment to

- following and practicing the way of Jesus by adhering to the apostles teaching (v. 42)
- experiencing signs and wonders (v. 43)
- radical generosity (v. 45)
- regular acts of breaking bread in homes and steadfast, faith-filled prayer (v. 42)
- worshiping together (v. 47)

As the gospel spread to different cities and groups, the culture of the Church remained the same and when it waivered, God sent apostles to remind them where they had strayed. Culture in the church is like soil that needs to be tended so that when the seed of the gospel comes in it produces lasting and community-impacting fruit.



STORY: Acts 2:42-47 (Read aloud)

MEMORY VERSE:

Matthew 13:23a - As for what was sown on good soil, this is the one who hears the word and understands it.



HEAD LEVEL: These questions help us to examine what the Word tells us.

HEART LEVEL: These questions help us wrestle with what we believe.

- When you think of the phrase "kingdom culture", what comes to mind, and why?
- What does the church need in order to have a healthy, kingdomfocused culture?



HANDS LEVEL: These questions help us commit to a next step and live it out in our everyday lives.

• Pray together. Ask God what area of the Kingdom He is calling you to step into this season.
